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Health Department Lifts St. Andrews Swimming Advisory; Clam Creek Advisory Remains

GLYNN COUNTY, GA— The Glynn County Health Department has lifted the advisory for St. Andrews Beach (from Macy Lane to the St. Andrews picnic area) on Jekyll Island.

The advisory was issued on January 27, 2010, after routine water quality tests showed a high level of enterococci bacteria which increase the risk of gastrointestinal illness in swimmers.

Subsequent water samples taken showed that the bacteria levels have dropped below Environmental Protection Agency's recommended limits. Therefore the advisory has been lifted.

Clam Creek Beach (from Clam Creek to the old North picnic area) on Jekyll Island remains under advisory. The Glynn County Health Department recommends you do not swim or wade in the water in this area. Fish and other seafood caught from this area should be thoroughly washed with fresh water and thoroughly cooked before eating.

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
