## St. Simons South Beach and Jekyll St. Andrews Beach Advisories Remain; Three Additional Advisories Issued

**GLYNN COUNTY, GA** – Clam Creek Beach (from Clam Creek to the old north picnic area) on Jekyll Island; North Beach at Goulds Inlet (from 15<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> Street) on St. Simons Island; and 5<sup>th</sup> Street Crossover Beach (from Cedar Street to 9<sup>th</sup> Street) on St. Simons Island have been placed under advisory by the Glynn County Health Department. The advisories for South Beach at the Lighthouse (from 9<sup>th</sup> Street to the pier) on St. Simons Island and St. Andrews Beach (from Macy Lane to the St. Andrews picnic area) on Jekyll Island remain in place.

These advisories are only for the areas specified above and do not impact any other beaches on the island. These beach water advisories are to alert the public of a possible risk of illness associated with water contact but do not mean the beaches are closed.

Routine water quality tests from samples taken January 9, 2013 at those locations showed a high level of enterococci bacteria which increase the risk of gastrointestinal illness in swimmers.

The Glynn County Health Department recommends you do not swim or wade in the water in the areas under advisory. Fish and other seafood caught from these areas should be thoroughly washed with fresh water and thoroughly cooked before eating as should fish or seafood caught from any waters.

The areas will be retested on January 10 and the advisories will be lifted when tests show the bacteria levels meet the Environmental Protection Agency's recommended standards.
