Re: Letter of Permission (LOP), Activities within the State's Jurisdiction, 2018 Labor Day Beach Bash and the 2018 New Year's Eve Event, South Beach, Tybee Island, Chatham County, Georgia

Dear Ms. Webster:

This Letter of Permission (LOP) is in response to your request to host the 2018 Labor Day Beach Bash and the 2018 New Year's Eve Event on the South Beach area of Tybee Island. The 2018 Labor Day Beach Bash is a one day event that will occur on Sunday, September 2, 2018 and be completed the same day. The 2018 New Year's Eve Event is a one day event that will occur on Monday, December 31, 2018.

Your request includes the placement of temporary crowd control measures in order to create a fireworks safety zone in association with the 2018 Labor Day Beach Bash and 2018 New Year's Eve Event. Working in conjunction with the Tybee Island Police Department, the safety zone will be created using cones to secure the area immediately north and south of the Tybee Pier & Pavilion. The public will be able to traverse the beach landward of fireworks safety zone and spectators will be able to observe the fireworks from a controlled distance. The fireworks safety zone will be delineated using City of Tybee Island Police traffic cones that will be set up the day of the event and removed as soon as the event concludes. To prevent and minimize marine debris associated with the display, please remove any debris from the fireworks that land on the beach or pier at the conclusion of each event. Dispose of the debris in a fire-safe container and remove it from the public beach at the end of the event.

The Department authorizes the temporary activities associated with the events as depicted in the attached project description and location map. Best Management Practices (BMPs) should be used to prevent any additional impacts at the site and to protect the shore jurisdictional areas.

This LOP is not meant to exempt the above referenced activities from future environmental laws. No unauthorized equipment, materials, or debris may be placed, disposed of, or stored in jurisdictional areas. Any incidental impacts associated with this project must be rectified by fully restoring areas to their pre-construction topographic and vegetative states. This LOP is valid for the above referenced projects.


#### 2018 Beach Permits needed for below events.

#### 1. Labor Day Beach Bash - Sunday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>:

- Fireworks on the Pier around 9:15p.m.
- Fireworks and cone setup approximately at 8:00-10:00a.m. and teardown at approximately 10:45p.m. to 1:00a.m.
- Tybee Police will block off the fire safety zone around the Pier with cones and secure it throughout the day approximately 420 feet from the fireworks. (See attached diagram)
- Band with stage on the Pavilion 7:00-10:45p.m.

#### 2. New Year's Eve-Monday, December 31st:

- Fireworks on the Pier at midnight
- Fireworks and cone setup approximately at 8:00-10:00a.m. and teardown at approximately 12:15a.m. to 1:00a.m.
- Tybee Police will block off the fire safety zone around the Pier with cones and secure it throughout the day approximately 420ft from the fireworks. (See attached diagram)



# Labor Day Beach Bash - Sunday, September 3<sup>rd</sup> and New Year's Eve - Monday, December 31st:

#### Fireworks Safety Zone:

To be determined by the fireworks contract (approximately 420 ft.) radius from the fireworks will be blocked off with cones/stanchions with rope by the Tybee Island Police Department. The Tybee Police will secure the area while the fireworks are on the Pier. Red glow sticks will be around the blocked off area.
