Re: Letter of Permission (LOP) for Sign Relocation and Trimming, Turtle River Marshes, Highway 17, Glynn County, Georgia (GPS: 30.96913°N, -81.40882°W)

Dear Mr. Jensen:

This Letter of Permission (LOP) is in response to your request, received August 30, 2022, to remove the existing billboard sign and install a new sign in the vicinity of the entrance to Jekyll Island off US Highway 17. This project was previously issued an LOP on December 21, 2015; August 15, 2016; and February 19, 2020 but has not been completed due to incomplete funding. This project involves complete removal of the existing sign which is partially in jurisdiction of the Coastal Marshlands Protection Act (CMPA) and installing a new sign approximately 85ft. to the east, out of jurisdiction, as shown in the attached description. Work will be completed using a boom truck and track hoe and approximately 800 sq.ft. of construction matting will be used to access the area. All material removed will be disposed of off-site. The work will begin no sooner than 15 days from the date of this letter and completed within 6 months.

The Department authorizes the removal of the existing billboard sign and installation of a new sign as depicted in the attached description and drawing. All material removed must be disposed of at an appropriate upland disposal site. Any change in the use, location, dimensions, or configuration of the approved project within jurisdiction, without prior notification and approval from this office, could result on the revocation of this approval and in required removal of the materials and related structures.

Trimming of approximately 350ft. of non-jurisdictional woody vegetation is proposed in association with this project. Work will be completed exclusively from the upland using hand tools. During work any vegetative debris generated will be removed and disposed of at an appropriate upland area off-site. The trimming proposed in your request will not require marsh

access and any debris that falls within jurisdiction will need to be removed by hand. Any deviations from the submitted project scope and description may require further review.

This LOP does not relieve you from obtaining any other required federal, state, or local permits. Tidal water bottoms and marshlands of coastal Georgia are public trust lands controlled by the State, except for such lands where a validated Crown Grant or State Grant exists. 

Jekyll Island Sign Replacement

Scope Of Work.


- 1. Remove existing Jekyll Island Sign
- 2. Install New Jekyll Island Sign as shown in attached drawings. All of the work will be done with either a boom truck or track hoe. Any impact into the wetlands with this equipment would be minimized with the use of matts as needed. Each sign pole shall be place into the ground with an auger from the track hoe and all removed material shall be removed from the sight.
- 3. Cut upland bushes by hand tools for 350' North of the new location and remove all debris from the sight.

NOTE: The escape of sediment from the site shall be prevented by the installation of erosion and sediment control measures and practices prior to, or concurrent with, land disturbing activities. Erosion control measures will be maintained at all times. If full implementation of the approved plan does not provide for effective erosion control, additional erosion and sediment control measures shall be implemented to control or treat the sediment source. All equipment around the work shall use16'x 25' matts as needed.




