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**NOTE A:** Navigation regulations are published in Chapter 2, U.S. Coast Pilot 4. Additional regulations to Chapter 2 are published in the Notice to Mariners. Information concerning the regulations may be obtained at the Office of the Commander, 7th Coast Guard District in Miami, Florida, or at the Office of the District Engineer, Corps of Engineers in Savannah, Georgia. Refer to charted regulation section numbers.

**NOTE X:** With the 12-radial mile National Sea, established by Presidential Proclamation, some Federal waters apply. The Three National Mile Line, previously identified as the outer limit of the territorial sea, is retained as it continues to depict the jurisdictional limit of the other sea. The 12-radial mile National Sea and the 3-radial mile Federal Waters, Texas and Puerto Rico, and the Three National Mile Line elsewhere remain in effect unless the inner limit of the jurisdiction of the state. The 24-radial mile Contiguous Zone and the 200-radial mile Exclusive Economic Zone were established by Presidential Proclamation. Areas that fall outside of the U.S. Supreme Court, these maritime limits are subject to modification.

**NOAA WEATHER RADIO BROADCASTS:** The NOAA Weather Radio stations listed below provide continuous voice broadcasts. The reception range is typically 20 to 40 nautical miles from the antenna site, but can be as much as 100 nautical miles for stations at high elevations.
