Re: Letter of Permission (LOP) and Revocable License (RL) for Installation of a Sanitary Sewer Line, Wilmington Island, Tidal Drainage Ditch Associated with Betz Creek, Chatham County, Georgia. (USACE#: SAS- 2017-00552)

Dear Mr. Boswell:

This Letter of Permission (LOP) is in response to your request on behalf of Robert M. Chu, dated June 10, 2020, to install a sanitary sewer line in a county maintained tidal drainage ditch associated with Betz Creek, Chatham County, Georgia. The sewer line was initially permitted to be directionally bored under the canal in accordance with Coastal Marshlands Protection Act Permit (CMPA) #759. According to your request, the contractor hired to perform the drilling activities was unable to advance the sewer line under the canal. The sewer line is now proposed to be installed by open cut through the tidal drainage ditch. The Department is in receipt of a letter from the Chatham County Department of Engineering that states Chatham County has no objection to installing the sewer by open cut. The proposed open cut will be performed by an excavator located on the upland and will be approximately 4ft. x 30ft. A 4in. double diaphragm pump and a 3in. mud hog pump will be utilized to prepare the site for the open cut excavation. The portion of the project to impact coastal marshlands will be the excavation of 120sq.ft. of the tidal drainage ditch as well as temporary impacts resulting from construction equipment. The project will begin no sooner than fifteen (15) days from the receipt of this letter and be completed within six (6) months.

The Department authorizes the tidal ditch excavation as depicted in the attached description and drawings. No unauthorized equipment, vehicles, materials, or debris may be placed in, disposed of, or stored in jurisdictional areas. All material removed must be disposed of at an appropriate upland disposal area. Any visible alterations in marsh topography will be restored immediately using low-impact hand tools. Any damage to the marsh vegetation that has not recovered naturally during the next growing season will be repaired by a method acceptable to the Department.

The tidal water bottoms and marshlands of coastal Georgia are public trust lands owned by the state, except where ownership of such lands is demonstrated through an unbroken chain of title to a valid Crown or State Grant. The Revocable License authorizes use of lands presumed to be owned by the State of Georgia, and which are under control of the State. You may proceed with construction subject to the understanding and condition that the Revocable License could be rendered invalid should another person demonstrate ownership to such lands pursuant to a valid Crown Grant or State Grant. This authorization does not relieve you from obtaining any other

required federal, state, or local permits. If you have any questions you may contact Paul Tobler at (912) 262-3134.

Letter Of Permission

To Whom It May Concern,

This letter is a request for permission or authorization to open cut a Chatham County canal which is maintained by mechanical means and which contains a DNR jurisdictional line without a 25' buffer requirement. This line will be for the installation of a sanitary sewer line which will belong to the City of Savannah and will serve a new subdivision. The newly bored line is planned to be a minimum of one foot below the invert of the canal.

The reason for the open cut request is that the contractor could not get a bore to advance under the bottom of the canal as originally intended. The proposed sewer line will belong to the City of Savannah and they have requested that we tie to an existing sanitary pump station which is on the opposite side of the canal from the planned subdivision.

The impacts for the open cut are as follows:

Buffer impact = 0 sf total

Direct impact = 120 sf total

The impacts will be a minimum of one foot below the invert of the canal.

Equipment and methodology:

- 4' wide trench x 30' long
- 220 Volvo EX excavator
- 4" double diaphragm pump
- 3" mud hog pump
- Back up 4" pump available if needed
- Back up CAT Excavator available if needed

To Whom It May Concern,

This letter is in response to the Owner's request to revise the referenced subdivision construction plans to perform an open cut installation instead of the originally approved bore under the Woodridge Canal. Woodridge Canal is the Chatham County canal on Wilmington Island that is maintained by mechanical means and contains a DNR jurisdictional line. However, no wrested vegetation exists due to the mechanical maintenance of the drainage structure.

The reason for the open cut request is that the contractor could not get a bore to advance under the bottom of the canal as originally approved and permitted. The proposed sewer line will belong to the City of Savannah and they have requested that the new line tie to an existing sanitary pump station which is on the opposite side of the canal from the planned subdivision.

We have reviewed the plan revision from BDSI on C-6, revision dated 5-17-20, and we have no objection to installing the sewer by open cut.
