

Important information for

COMMERCIAL FISHERMEN, SEAFOOD DEALERS, & WHOLESALERS

Georgia law requires a completed trip ticket for ALL trips landing marine or anadromous species (American Eel, American Shad, and Hickory Shad). If you are using commercial gear, this requirement applies even if your catch is intended for personal consumption.

HOW do I report landings?

Download reporting forms at <u>CoastalGaDNR.org/Landings</u> and fill them out using the free Adobe Acrobat reader. Email the completed form to <u>landings@dnr.ga.gov</u>.

You can also print the form and fill it out by hand before mailing it to **Fisheries Statistics**, **One Conservation Way**, **Brunswick**, **GA 31520**. DNR can also provide you with forms and envelopes. To request forms, call 912-264-7218 or email landings@dnr.ga.gov.

You can also pick them up in person at the DNR office at the address above. The office is open Monday to Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

WHO is responsible for submitting the ticket?

All crabbers and castnet shrimp fishermen submit their own tickets. Fishermen who sell their own catch to the public or to businesses that do not have a seafood dealer license submit their own tickets. Fishermen who sell a single trip's catch to multiple businesses report their own catch. Generally, if you sell your catch to a shrimp dock, they will submit the trip ticket for you.



WHY is this important?

Data collection from commercial trips is vital to fishery management. Having accurate value for Georgia's fisheries has become more important than ever, as natural disasters, fishery failures, and economic events impact the seafood industry.

Economic aid to commercial fishermen and fishing communities is based upon the data collected by trip tickets.

Unreported landings make Georgia's fisheries appear to be less valuable than they really are, and the industry does not receive the amount of compensation it is entitled to.

Your reported landings are directly tied to the amount of compensation you may receive if a fishery failure is declared in the future.

WHAT about my privacy?

ALL of the data collected are confidential and protected by state and federal law. It is not shared with state or federal tax authorities.
