Wildlife and Other Wonders Outdoors



Wildlife and Other Wonders (W.O.W.) Outdoors program is an opportunity for our guests to build a custom program that best suits the needs of their group, club, or company. With a wide variety of outdoor opportunities available within the 6,700 acre Clybel Wildlife Management Area, we will work with you to craft a perfect and unforgettable experience. A session of W.O.W. Outdoors is designed for groups of 10 or more with participants ages 11+. Up to three of the following programs (with each program lasting 45-60 minutes in duration), may be selected.

CANOEING (SELF-GUIDED)

\$5 per person

Jump into a canoe and paddle around Lake Margery, one of our largest lakes on the Marben Public Fishing Area.

CANOEING (GUIDED)

\$10 per person

Join a naturalist on the water as we paddle around Lake Margery and explore the natural history of the area and ecology of the lake.

ARCHERY

\$10 per person

Nock an arrow and hit the bullseye with basic archery lessons. With compound bows, staff will train you on safety and archery basics. You can choose to use static or 3-D animal targets.

FIREARMS

\$15 / \$25 per person*

Join an instructor at the Charlie Elliott Wildlife Center's Educational Range. Staff will provide safety and shooting instruction as you utilize our firearms. Choose between BB gun, pellet rifle, or shotgun. *Dependent on your choice of firearm. Contact CEWC for specific pricing.

FISHING

\$5 per person

Grab a fishing rod and cast into one of our lakes for bass, bream, or catfish. Staff will provide equipment and bait. Catch and release only. Participants 16 and older are required to have a Georgia fishing license which can be purchased upon arrival for program.

LOW ROPES CHALLENGE COURSE

\$15 per person

The low challenge course is an excellent choice for groups looking for team building opportunities. Concepts include communication, trust, cooperation, encouragement, and goal setting.

NATURE SKILLS

\$5 per skill, per person

Hone your skills in outdoor recreation. Staff will lead hands-on demonstrations to improve your outdoor abilities in orienteering, fire building, shelter building, birding, wild and medicinal plant identification, owl pellet dissections, and specialty hikes. Each skill class is 1 hour in length, with a limit of 3 skills per group.



WILDLIFE PRESENTATION

\$45 flat rate fee for a group up to 30

Get up close and personal with some of Georgia's native wildlife. Using live animals as visual aids, a naturalist will discuss conservation topics and natural history of Georgia.

JR. RANGER PROGRAM

Stop by the museum and pick up a Jr. Ranger Activity guide and start exploring the plants and animals that call this area their home.
